Alternative and Continuing Education Programs Continue to Expand

Brockville, ON – The Catholic District School Board of Eastern Ontario is pleased to announce the expansion of the Alternate and Continuing Education programs to more areas within our Board, offering greater opportunities for people to continue their education.

A new night school program is officially underway at St. Mary Catholic High School in Brockville and the Board plans to expand the successful Personal Support Worker Program.

The St. Mary Catholic High School night school program officially got underway on November 13, 2007. “The program is a wonderful opportunity for people in Brockville and the surrounding area,” said Superintendent of Education Mark Musca. “Feedback showed that there was a demand for this type of program in Brockville, as many wish to further or complete their education. The implementation of this program at St. Mary is giving people that opportunity.”

The CDSBEO has had night school programs running in Cornwall for more than 10 years and continues to develop new initiatives.

Plans are also underway to add another program to the Brockville area. The Continuing Education department under the leadership of St. Matthew’s Catholic Learning Centre Principal Beverley Bellefeuille plans to introduce the Personal Support Worker (PSW) program in Brockville, as well as the Russell area. The PSW program has been a success in Cornwall, and is being expanded in that city to meet demand.
