Double Gold and Hoping for More: St. Michael Catholic High School Sends Two Soccer Teams To OFSAA

Kemptville, On – Soccer fans at **St. Michael Catholic High School** in Kemptville have been cheering all season long, and will continue to cheer for another little while.

After claiming an unprecedented four LGSSAA single-A titles, (Junior/Senior Boys and Junior/Senior Girls), the school's soccer program's winning ways continued at the Eastern Ontario Level. Both the Senior Boys and Girls team took home EOSSAA championships. Both championships are firsts in St. Michael's school History.

At EOSSAA, The **Senior Girls** defeated fellow CDSBEO School Notre Dame Catholic High School from Carleton Place **1-0** in the gold medal game. The Senior Girls, under the tutelage of **Coach Sheri Camillone** will head for Kenora to compete for the **OFSAA** title beginning **Monday, June 5**.

The Senior Girls look to continue their **perfect 9-0 season**.

Coach Tony Camillone led the **Senior Boys** to a win over La Relais Ecole Secondaire from Hawksbury by the same 1-0 score. The victory earns the program its first ever gold medal at **EOSSAA**. The Boys spent the weekend of June 2 in Timmins, competing in the all-Ontario finals. The team won their first three games and advanced to the semi-final round. After a hard-fought match, the Senior Boys lost that game by a score of 2-0.

The Senior Boys finish with an impressive **10-3 record**.

St. Michael Principal Mark Musca is thrilled with the performances and stated, "Special congratulations to both senior team coaches, Tony Camillone and Sheri Camillone. They have toiled tirelessly in our soccer program building toward this outstanding achievement."
