Meeting Called to Order

Sue Wilson (Chair) called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and welcomed all members and guests.

I. Approval of Agenda

II. <u>Presentation</u>: Guidelines for Safe School Interventions – Legislation, range of suspensions, expulsions and the impact on students with special needs.

Norma McDonald, Heather Gerber and Heather Bovey presented on the Guidelines for Safe School Interventions. Information was shared on Zero tolerance and how the Ministry has moved to the Creating Safe and Accepting Schools polices. Various reports were described and are dependent on what type of incident has taken place. Activities for which suspension must be considered by the principal were shared.

It was stated that CDSBEO has not expelled any students in the last 10 years. Factors impacting the consideration of suspension/expulsion can include special education needs, progressive discipline and any defined antecedents. We respond to incidents by using progressive discipline, restorative practices and using proactive strategies to prevent inappropriate behaviour for happening. Alternative programs such as ABLE, Turning Points, MEP, Care and Treatment and specialized schools (St. Luke CHS and St. Matthew CSS) can also be considered.

The Board bully prevention model describes various programs that are used to prevent challenging behaviour in CDSBEO schools. Some of these initiatives include Roots of Empathy, Restorative Surveys, WITS, class profiles and mental health. Highlights of the SHINE magazine provide a framework of proactive strategies and techniques for understanding and managing students in the classroom.

Behaviour Management Systems (BMS) is a program that teaches staff how to deal with students who are escalating in behaviour and how to protect themselves from aggressive behaviour. The four phases are cyclical, and emphasis was put on the importance of debriefing.

Finally, data on the rate of suspensions was presented to SEAC. The Board will continue to focus on prevention and supporting students who are struggling.
