New Initiatives:

- OTF Family Innovation Scale Application being submitted with Open Doors of LCY serving as organizational mentor and charitable partner.
- RFASD asked and submitted a letter of support for the Coalition for Canadian Police Reform for Federal Regulatory Police College.
- RFASD has developed a 15 minute presentation in support of Bill 172 and will give a
 preview of the half-day and full day training educational training module. Theresa LalondePankow serves as the presenter. Module developed by an advisory committee consisting of
 a psychologist, occupational therapist, pediatrician, speech-language pathologist, mental
 health clinician, former and current educational admins, and CanFASD Instructional
 Designer.



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 RFASD Youth hosted a full-day fair on Aug 19 in Montague Township for 33 people with FASD and their caregivers from the Ottawa Valley celebrating their skills and strengths. All three levels of government were also represented. Four new families came and 380 new touchpoints were generated.

Other Information:

- RFASD website is under construction and hopefully will be launched by Oct 31.
- Shannon Russell is the new FASD worker for Lanark and Leeds-Grenville, from Kids
 Inclusive Beckwith Tech Camp, hosted a graphic design course over the summer partnership
 with Beckwith Township being explored to offer inexpensive graphic design option for
 individuals and small businesses.
- RFASD sitting on Quality Health Standards Committee representing lived experience related to transitional planning in Ontario.
- Due to OTF application environmental scan, RFASD is currently the largest non-profit
 organization in Ontario consisting entirely of lived disability experience. We have
 experienced a 67% growth in the past 9 months with 140 families and 510 people with lived
 experience now. We now have connections with FASD support groups from Quebec, New
 Brunswick, Hawaii and Australia attending our virtual support groups.

Cornwall Community Hospital – Deena Shorkey

- Referrals are back to normal with an expected typical increase end of September
- Wait time for clients that are not prioritized is estimated at two months
- Continuing to see a level of complexity of severe anxiety and depression
- Adding more master's degree prepared therapists, need for a higher level of expertise
- Children expressing significant anxiety with back to school, offering support groups
- 50/50 split of in office and virtual service
- Will be resuming school-based services, school boards allowing as an essential service
- Youth hub is continuing to operate in Cornwall and Rockland
- Looking to offer some in person groups in the Youth hub
- Youth hub will start to offer support services once a week, in Embrun, Alexandria, Hawkesbury and Winchester, so that children can access services (employment, mental health services, addiction, and health care services through the nurse.)
- Starting a Board for the Hub, four youth, (two from Prescott-Russell and two from SDG that are joining, two parents and four agencies) hoping to find two more parents to make it 4/4/4, to help codesign the services in the Hub
- Looking to increase awareness to recent tragedy in Cornwall, have spoken to Mental Health
 and Addictions nurse who works with the Catholic School Board, to keep an eye on possible
 issues that may present for when school opens

IV. Department Update

- 1. Our Summer Transition Program took place this past week in five CDSBEO schools to support the return to in class learning for many students in special education programs. The program began with a day for the teacher and EAs to review IEPs, other relevant information about their students, and to plan for the week. Activities that took place included practicing daily routines, such as arrival, washroom, recess, lunch, and departure procedures. Students had opportunities to walk around their schools and practice fire procedures. They also had the opportunity to participate in social-emotional lessons, reinforce skills, and complete language and math activities.
- 2. The annual Learning Fair for educators took place yesterday. The Special Education Department offered two workshops:
 - o 'Programming for Students Accessing Learning Through Alternative Expectations: Where Do I Begin? Steps to Measure Student Success Using a Behavioural Lens' (Presenter: Sandra O'Doherty, Behaviour Analyst)
 - o 'Breaking the Code with Decodable Books' by our Speech and Language Department team and was an extension to the Science of Reading in services that took place last year.
- 3. Many informative sessions are taking place for all staff over the three PD days this week including Information on Medical Plans of care, learning recovery, intervention strategies and reengagement. Our board Occupational Therapist, Janet Carioni, and Mental health Lead, Michelle Neville, presented on Mental Health and Well-being "A Mentally Heathy Return to School". In this presentation, staff learned about the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on children, youth and families and explored strategies to incorporate in their teaching.
- 4. With the addition of a Mental Health professional, we are now able to offer counselling support to our elementary schools and will have one counsellor for the western region and one counsellor for the eastern region.



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V. Student Re-Engagement Presentation – Heather Gerber

Superintendent Gerber shared the CDSBEO re-engagement plan as well as some of the current thinking on what educators, schools and the board can do to help students re-engage with school and learning. The focus, this year, is on making students feel welcome in our midst and that students and their mental wellness are supported. This is important given that it is social connectedness that provides the energy for cognitive engagement. Providing a learning lift for students who may have experienced learning loss due the pandemic will be ongoing throughout the school year as educators work collaboratively with students and families to ensure student success.
