II. Association Updates

<u>Lanark County Support Services – Amanda Banfield</u> Report update:

- LCSS staff will be receiving Trauma Informed Care training this December.
- A virtual staff celebration was held game show style for our current and past team members. A fun evening of trivia and socializing.
- We have begun to offer up to three days for participants in our agencies as we have begun to go into the community once again. Many of our work experiences and volunteering locations have requested we return.
- TSS is accepting referrals and continues to assist with transitioning from youth to adult services, navigating the adult system and pro-actively planning for individuals.

<u>Cornwall Community Hospital – Deena Shorkey</u> Report update:

- Continuing to see an increase in the number of referrals for youth with complex /urgent mental health needs
- Increase in the number of caregivers requesting supports regarding their own stressors during the pandemic, we are assisting more caregivers with accessing their own mental health services and providing more family-based supports to address these issues
- Receiving many referrals from school boards as they seem to be dealing with increased pressures in regard to students needs
- As lead agency our multi year report is due at the end of November and we are working on putting forward proposals to address the gap in short term residential services and intensive support services to youth and families during times of crisis- there is some indication that there may be new funding investments

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<u>Rural FASD Support Network – Rob More</u> Report update:

- On Nov 20, caregivers and adults with FASD met and determined the evaluation process we will be using going forward to determine the effectiveness of our programming by giving input to our logic model.
- Our expression of interest for the Trillium Youth Innovation Fund was accepted and we have now been invited to submit an application. With Open Doors as our organizational mentor to provide financial management and organizational mentoring, and our assigned OTF manager, we are in process to finalize our application. If we receive the funding, we will hire a fulltime coordinator, part-time marketer and lease an office space.
- Our expression of interest for the Growing Expertise in Evaluation Fund has been accepted. With the assigned evaluator from Brain Science Ontario who is helping us develop our evaluation capacity and logic model, we are also completing an application to hire a full-time program manager and evaluator with a part-time fundraising position
- We have been invited to complete an application with the Enabling Accessibility fund to provide a forum for our youth to share their lived experiences.
- With the help of a federal political strategist, we are currently in conversations with some potential corporate sponsors.
- Andrew Jahn, musician, is currently developing a tour for the spring which will see a portion of the proceeds go to our organization. More details to come.
- CanFASD has now released their online course for frontline workers primarily in the area of social services identifying best practices. <u>https://estore.canfasd.ca/identifying-best-practices-for-fasd</u>
- CanFASD is also updating their online courses for educators with the most recent research being included. Release date is estimated to be February.
- Due to continuing advocacy at the federal level, we are being told to watch for the federal budget in terms of support for people with FASD.
- CMHO is hosting a webinar again this year on FASD at their annual conference which includes Janet Carioni. Webinar is designed for mental health clinicians but open and free to anyone. <u>https://us06web.zoom.us/webinar/register/WN_kbWv9onDRoSjMQXbI0oO8w</u>



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III. Department Update

- Hired two Re-Engagement Consultants to support students and families who have not attended school, have had inconsistent attendance, or have disengaged from their learning. The consultant will work in collaboration with the school team to connect students to a network of supports in the school community to support re-engagement.
- Many recent professional development sessions have taken place and are ongoing including:
 - New Itinerant ABLE Workers recently completed Violent Threat Risk Assessment.
 - New Special Education Resource Teacher (SERT) training.
 - Ongoing sessions to support the new IEP platform in ASPEN.
 - For the PD Day this Friday, SSWs, IAWs, and EAs, will participate in Behavioural Management System (BMS) certification, recertification, and various workshops. Workshop topics include:
 - Using Assistive Tools Authentically (Corey Kalsi, *Technology Consultant* and Julie Marshall, *Assistive Technology Educational Assistant*)
 - Overview of Student Mental Health Resources Available at CDSBEO (*Michelle Neville, Mental Health Lead* Presenter:)
 - A Word in the Hands (Lori Murphy, Deaf and Hard of Hearing Specialist
 - Below the Behaviour: Using brain science to better understand student behaviour and fostering growth (Janet Carioni, Occupational Therapist)
 - Effective Strategies to Support Students with Attention Difficulties (Dr. Krista Kiiffner, *Lead Psychologist* and Leigh-Ann Ellis, Trisha Gill, Nicole Oattes, Joanne Fong, *Pycho-Educational Consultant Team*)
- CDSBEO Speech Language Pathologists and Special Education Consultants will be supporting St. Joseph's, Gananoque with a Leadership and Innovation Funding for Teachers (LIFT) grant, whose topic is the *Science of Reading*!
- We now have a brochure to explain the Education & Community Partnership Program (ECPP) to families and agencies. CDSBEO has three sites: Bishop Macdonell, Cornwall; St. Francis Xavier, Brockville; and Pope John Paul II, Hammond.
- For the 2021-22 school year, the Ministry of Education will once again make changes to the Special Incidence Portion (SIP), to provide school boards with greater operational flexibility and reduced administrative requirements due to the ongoing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. (SIP is one of the six allocations that make up the Special Education Grant, which is part of the Grants for Student Needs. SIP is intended to support students with extraordinarily high needs who require more than two full-time staff to address their health and/or safety needs, and those of others at their school).
 - \circ $\;$ There will be no SIP claims-based process in 2021-22.
 - $\circ~$ All school boards will be funded at their 2020-21 SIP allocation amounts, plus a 5% increase.

 - Letter was received from Lisa Nightingale, Chapter & Volunteer Supervisor, Autism Ontario, appointing Nicole Taylor to sit as the representative for Autism Ontario.

This recommendation goes forward to the board of trustees for their consideration on December 14th, 2021, to appoint Nicole Taylor as representative for autism Ontario.
