- Approaching year 3 of our YOF (Youth Opportunities Fund) Funding. The Executive Director, Shelley More, continues to work with Gelder Gingras & Associates, Eva Maxwell on Governance and Strategic Planning.
- We have hired a new Marketing and Administrative Coordinator, Tanya Speight, who started Feb 13, 2024. As well as looking at potential candidates to hire through the Canada Summer Jobs program. A government program that helps create summer job opportunities for young individuals.
- We are in the planning phase for a Red Shoes Run Family Day to be held on Saturday, May 11, 2024, in Montague Twp. As part of this we are working with our school boards to have a school presentation on May 10, 2024, at St. Luke Catholic High School in Smiths Falls and Montague Public School in Montague with RJ Formanek, Red Shoes Rock founder, adult living with FASD, as well as Rural FASD Support Network Youth voices.
