5. LD at School with Martin Smit, Educational Consultant for LD@School

The Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario (LDAO) is a registered charity dedicated to improving the lives of children, youth, and adults with learning disabilities. LDAO offers many resources, services, information, venues, and products designed to help people with LDs and ADHD, as well as parents, teachers, and other professionals.

Martin provided useful information and resources from <u>LDAO</u> and about <u>LD@School</u> and <u>LD@Home</u>.

<u>LD@School</u> is a project of the Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario (LDAO) and includes a website as well as the Educators' Institute (summer conference).

- Has developed resources for educators which are researchable by various traits (topic, grade, type, etc.).
- Resources include podcasts, webinars, self-directed learning modules, and more which are all free to use.
- The LD@school website features resources and professional development material in a variety of formats. LD@school highlights evidence-based, evidence-informed, and practice-informed approaches, practices, and strategies that can be put directly to use in the classroom.

LD@Home was created to help bring resources to Ontario households impacted by learning disabilities.

- Provides information and resources that are geared towards families including podcasts, visuals and transcripts. All resources are free to use.
- Builds connections and provides information on local LD chapters and partner organizations

Special Education Department Update – Angie McNamee, Principal of Special Education Spring is a busy time a year with one foot ensuring schools and students are on track and well supported until the end of June, while the other foot is in the planning process for next year – reviewing needs, supporting student transitions and analyzing resource allocation for September.

Beginning now and leading into May, School administrators gather to review the board's multiyear strategic plan and the improvement plan to help support the revision of their schools' annual improvement and achievement plan. These sessions include discussions to better the programming, accommodation and delivery of curriculum and social skills learning, in order to improve student engagement, inclusion and achievement.

At the end of this month, we have seventy-two CDSBEO students participating in the weeklong mini-course program at Carleton University and University of Ottawa. This initiative provides



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students with a glimpse of different post-secondary program opportunities and programs and informs their future decision making with course selection and future pathways.
