#### a. Rural FASD

Gr. 4-6 students from local CDSBEO and UCDSB schools were in attendance to show their support for the event. We have two more Red Shoe Run events to take place in the coming weeks.

#### 7. Special Education Department Update - Angie McNamee, Principal of Special Education

- Several professional staff members are currently finalizing assessments, preparing reports, and engaging with parents and school personnel. Meanwhile, others are providing inschool support to ensure a successful conclusion to the academic year.
- Schools and the Special Education department remain focused on transition planning for students with special education needs, ensuring that necessary environmental accommodations are ready for September. The team continues to evaluate student and school requirements to guarantee appropriate support at the school level.
- The EA draft is scheduled for next week, with the Special Education department collaborating closely with HR and CUPE in preparation.
- The summer transition program for students in MEP classes and those with complex needs will be offered again this year at select schools that open in late August.
  Preliminary information is currently being gathered from schools to facilitate the next steps.
