Topic 1:	Literacy - K-12 Teachers
Entity Hosting:	School Board
Facilitators:	School Board Program Staff-Principals
Description:	

The principal will help facilitate the delivery of material and discussions that highlight changes to the Grades 1-8 Language and Grade 9 De-streamed English curricula. A focus will be on exploring the continuum for specific expectations and how the changes impact instructional practices. Teachers will engage in activities and discussions on how we can support our students as we implement these new curriculum expectations related to literacy connections and applications, foundations of language, comprehension, and composition.

Topic 2:High Impact Instructional Practices and Strategies - K-12 teachersEntity Hosting:School BoardFacilitators:School Board Program Staff-PrincipalsDescription:School Board Program Staff-Principals

Teachers will join one of 3 sessions (Mathematics, French as a Second Language (FSL), Universal Design for Learning (UDL)) dependent on their teaching role.

- In the Mathematics session, teachers will carry out guided discussions in small groups, which will help identify strengths of each grade as well as academic challenges and typical gaps at each grade level. Together, each divisional group will review a continuum of key curriculum expectations, explore the newly added teacher supports within the curriculum resource, and share the use of highimpact instructional practices relevant to their division.
- In the FSL session, Kindergarten to grade 8 teachers will explore a resource to help support second-language readers. Additionally, teachers will explore the Second Language Reading Continuum and how it directly applies to the French as a Second Language curriculum and the Common European Framework of Reference. Grade 9-12 teachers will review the Common European Framework of Reference and identify strategies within the continuum that directly impact instruction within the core and immersion French classes. Teachers will also explore a resource that directly links to the continuum and the FSL curriculum to help develop students' oral, listening, reading, and writing competencies.
- In the UDL session, teachers will explore high impact instructional practices such as differentiated instruction, culturally relevant and responsive pedagogy and assessment practices that support student achievement in all subject areas.

Staff will engage in Child Sexual Abuse Prevention Training provided by the Canadian Centre for Child Protection.
